Who may attend? Today's Wood Badge is for all leaders in the Boy Scouts of America. It has been developed for Cub Scout, Boy Scout, and Venturing leaders, as well as Council and District leaders.

Qualifications to attend. Each Scouter invited to participate in Wood Badge training must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America, at least 18yrs of age, and have completed the basic training courses for their current Scouting position. They must be physically cleared by a physician and present a completed BSA medical form.

What is Wood Badge? Wood Badge is designed primarily to further the training of adult leaders in the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). Participants learn techniques that make them better leaders, and they learn how to lead groups to achieve objectives. Many Scouters consider Wood Badge to be the peak experience of their Scouting careers.

Why attend? Understand Scouting as a family of interrelated, values-based programs providing age-appropriate activities for youth. Recognize leadership concepts. Apply the skills you learn to your Scouting role, at work, at home, and elsewhere. Revitalize your commitment to Scouting.

Where and when is the course offered? At Camp Geiger, Pony Express Scout Camp near St. Joseph, MO. The Course is weekend sessions, **April 17-19 and May 8-9. Pre course meeting March 11.**

What is the cost? \$200 with a \$75 minimum registration deposit.
